The event, celebrating the golden jubilee of Sri Kotala Basaveshwara Bharatiya Shikshana Samiti, Sedam, is being organised in partnership with Bharat Vikas Sangam and Vikas Academy, Kalaburagi, under the theme 'From Nature to Culture'. It will feature conferences addressing various subjects, including motherhood, education, youth, village agriculture, food, self-employment, nature, service, country, religion, and culture. The proceedings will be held at Anubhava Mantapa. Basavaraj Patil said that the participants would include former president Ram Nath Kovind, former US vice-president Al Gore, education

secretary of Mauritius Yudhishthira Manbod, seers, saints, religious leaders, national and international intellectuals, Arjuna awardees, over 50 Padma Shri awardees, former military officers, and others.

The Bharatiya Sanskriti Utsav featured a wide range of cultural activities that attracted both locals and visitors from different parts of India. The students had the opportunity to participate in and observe the following key events:
